Talk Boost in Foundation Stage	All children involved developed skills in social interaction, turn taking, listening and attention. There was an increase in vocabulary and a development in language – being able to speak in sentences.	£900
Additional teacher in Key Stage 1, one day a week focusing on reading and phonics	Targeted children were given an additional opportunity to learn phonics through singing phonics.  Small groups were provided with an additional targeted guided read with a teacher to focus on decoding words, understanding the language and text and extending vocabulary. This was beneficial as it showed a rise in confidence and ability within the reading SAT at the end of Year 2.	£8,000
Additional teacher	A teacher in KS1 to allow for smaller classes and only single year group classes.	£30,000
Bug club morning club for Key Stage 1	This provided an opportunity for the all children to access the books and resources available online to develop the love for reading.	£5000

Fischer Family Trust reading intervention in KS1 on a daily 1:1 basis for 20 weeks.	The 1:1 FFT sessions allowed structured intervention focusing on a faster development in phonics, spelling, reading and writing.	£3400
Lunchtime social club	This provision allowed the school to support behavioural needs, the emotional welfare of individuals, developing self-esteem and readiness to learn.	£150
Learning support Assistant in every class in Lower KS2 and an additional one.	This provided the three classes with an adult and one extra, being able to focus on the children's individual needs. The support was provided within the classroom or with a specific intervention.	£36,000
Support for residential visits in years 3/4 and 5/6.	Pupils are able to join the experience of the residential supporting both the wider learning experiences, further development of social skills and facilitate for a growing independence.	£1950
Support the costs associated with off site visits where a voluntary contribution is requested.	All children are able to take part in off site visits. Children benefit from a different learning environment and the variety of learning opportunities to enhance the classroom work and attainment.	£575
Resources	Educational resources to support programmes of work with individuals and small groups.	£2300
A supplement in music lessons with an instrument of their choice.	Children having the opportunity to learn how to play an instrument. It has also provided some children to recognise a new interest, motivation and changing behaviours for learning.	£1100
